

**Digging Deeper:** Ben Witherington III attempts to reenchant our reading of Paul in this creative reconstruction of ancient Corinth. Following a fictitious Corinthian man named Nicanor through an eventful week of business dealings and conflict, you will encounter life at various levels of Roman society-eventually meeting Paul himself and gaining entrance into the Christian community there. The result is an unforgettable introduction to life in a major center of the New Testament world. Numerous full-page text boxes expand on a variety of aspects of life and culture as we encounter them in the narrative.

Witherington is a world-renowned New Testament scholar, Professor of New Testament Interpretation at Asbury Theological Seminary, and an ordained pastor in the United Methodist Church. This 7 week study begins on January 3.

# Financial Report

As the end of the year approaches, your Church Council and Finance Committee continue to be amazed by how blessed our congregation has been by God's goodness and your faithful support. We anticipate ending 2020 with our obligations met and a small surplus to begin the New Year.

When the pandemic began, we applied for a loan through the Paycheck Protection Program. We received those funds due in part to extra effort by our treasurer, Skip Lancaster. We placed them in a set aside "just in case they were needed." In November, the loan was forgiven by the Small Business Administration and we still had the original amount in our account. Council decided to put half back into our community by funding our new monthly dinners and through gifts to the Lighthouse Foundation of Butler; Roots of Faith and the Bakerstown UMC Day School. The rest of the PPP monies are in a "Pandemic Reserve Fund" for use if they are needed.

Another example of how blessed we have been this year is the excellent work of our Trustees in making necessary improvements and upgrades to our buildings. There have been two major projects completed this year. The roof on our entire building has been replaced and the old steeple on the former sanctuary removed. This project was funded by the Major Project Fund, which is part of our operating budget with some assistance from a generous gift last year. The second improvement to our building was an upgrade to our sound system to improve the audio both in worship and on the live stream. This was funded by individual gifts. We also purchased 2 new cameras for our live stream Sunday mornings services from the Memorial Fund. Some other building improvements include replacing emergency lights in our building. A portion of the funding of this project came from the proceeds from selling the Giant Eagle gift cards.

Thank you for supporting the ministry of Bakerstown United Methodist Church. Your generosity enables us to minister to one another, our community, and our world in Jesus' name. Happy New Year!
