From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Greetings in the name of Jesus! I am writing this on a cold, dreary day in February, which isn't exactly breaking news because I am sitting in the northern suburbs of Pittsburgh. It has been a couple of weeks since Punxsutawney Phil's prediction of an early Spring. While many make fun of the groundhog's prognostications, I feel they provide a distraction from the dreariness of winter.

Spring will get here in due time. One sign of its pending arrival is the fact that the days are getting longer. During the month of February, we gain more than two minutes of sunlight a day. In other words, there will be over an hour more daylight on the last day of the month than there was on the first. The same is true for the month of March when we have an average gain of over two and half minutes of light each day! As the days grow longer, we draw closer to the arrival of Spring and hopefully warmer weather.

While many of us take for granted the fact that the Lenten season occurs during the arrival of Spring, some of us might not know the connection between Lent and Spring. The word Lent comes from the old English word "lencten" or lengthen. It literally refers to the lengthening of the days that occurs at this time of year.

We will soon see the earth come to life as the growing season arrives, which seems appropriate since Lent is a time of spiritual growth. As Christians, we know that Lent is the church's season of spiritual preparation for the celebration of Easter. The early church used it as a time to prepare candidates for baptism. Our church and many others today hold confirmation classes during the season of Lent. There are special services held to begin the season on Ash Wednesday and to conclude the season during Holy Week. These classes and services seek to provide us an opportunity to grow closer to the risen Lord.

Lent has long held special significance in my life. When I was sixteen years old, every sermon my pastor preached early in Lent seemed to be telling me to read my bible. I found a New Testament and started to read the Gospel of John. By the time I finished reading it, I believed what it said about Jesus. I knew that Jesus was who he said he was in those incredible "I am" statements such as "I am the way, the truth and the life." I trusted in him as my savior and Lord.

Every Lent since that, I have sought to grow closer to God. My prayer is that someone will be drawn into a personal relationship with Jesus through my preaching as I was when I heard my pastor's sermons all those year ago. Mostly, I pray that all of us will know God in a new way during this season of spiritual growth.


Something for Everyone.....

Bishop Cynthia Moore-Koikoi and the Rev. Alyce Weaver Dunn, director of connectional ministries, will lead a four-week Lenten study *Plenty Good Room*, based on African-American spirituals. Sessions will be held each Thursday, 7th, 14th, 21st & 28th in March from 7 to 9 p.m. at Bakerstown UMC.

The short-term Bible study combines an in-depth look at Scripture, American history, and the music and lyrics of six African American spirituals. It provides biblical, social, and historical analyses of the spirituals *Ev'ry Time I Feel the Spirit, This Lonesome Valley, Bow Down on Your Knees, Plenty Good Room, Ain't Dat Good News*, and *Were You There?*.

Marilyn E. Thornton, lead editor for Abingdon Press's Bible study series based on spirituals, wrote new lessons appropriate to the season for this study. She earned music degrees from Howard University and the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University, as well as a master of divinity degree from Vanderbilt.

Time to Save Your "Junque"


The days are getting longer and the robins will soon be returning. This can only mean one thing - the Junque Sale time is fast approaching!
